LIVESTOCK SHOW RING

REGISTRATION

Exhibitors must be enrolled in 4-H or FFA. Animals must be a 4-H or FFA project animal, cared for and records kept by the exhibitor.

4-H PORTFOLIO/FFA RECORD BOOK

All exhibitors must complete and submit a completed 4-H Portfolio/FFA Record Book on or before October 1, 2009 to the USU Extension Office. Anyone turning in a Portfolio/Record Book from October 2 through October 7 will be penalized \$15. 4-H Portfolio/FFA Record Book turned in after October 8 will be penalized \$25. **All FFA Record Books must be signed by FFA Advisor prior to submitting.** No checks will be released until a **complete** 4-H Portfolio/FFA Record Book is turned in.

AGE REQUIREMENT

Minimum Age: Must be at least 8 years old and in the 3rd grade as of January 1, 2009.

Maximum Age: Exhibitors can show at the fair immediately following their senior year of high school.

RESIDENT REQUIREMENT

1. All animals that are being raised to show in the Weber County Fair must be fed and cared for by the exhibitor.
2. The Exhibitor must be a county resident and the animal must be located within county boundaries.

OWNERSHIP REQUIREMENTS

1. Steers must be owned, tattooed and tagged for a period of 90 days prior to fair weigh in time.
2. Lambs must be owned and tagged for a period of 60 days prior to fair weigh in time.
3. Hogs must be owned and tagged for a period of 60 days prior to fair weigh in time.

DRESS CODE FOR SHOW

Exhibitors will be neat and clean in their appearance. The dress code for exhibitors during the show will be:

4-H: Long or short sleeved, collared, white shirt, navy blue or black pants, must have 4-H patch of left arm.

FFA: Official dress - black pants, white collared shirt, blue or black tie or FFA tie or scarf, FFA jacket. An FFA patch on the left arm may be substituted for the jacket.

CONDUCT

1. Any exhibitor or person connected with any exhibit interfering or using unsportsmanlike conduct will be dismissed from show.
2. Jr. Livestock Committee may release exhibitors from the show if they see unethical treatment of animals. Exhibitors failing to follow Jr. Livestock rules will forfeit *all* prize money.

ENTRY INFORMATION

1. There is no entry fee in the Junior Livestock Department. Each exhibitor will receive one complimentary week pass with the option to purchase two additional week passes at the exhibitor rate.
2. Entry forms must be filled out completely at time of tagging.
3. Each exhibitor has the opportunity to *show* one lamb, one hog and two steers.
4. Each exhibitor may only *sell* two animals (must be different species) at the auction.

TAGGING

1. No animals will be tagged after the 60/90 day requirement.
2. Each animal must attend one of the tagging dates, even if your animal has a state tag.
3. Each animal may be weighed in at tagging but it is not required.
4. Exhibitors will pay \$1 for each tag.
5. Each animal must be tagged in exhibitors' family name.

FAIR WEIGH IN TIMES

Weigh-in times:

HOGS: 6:00 - 7:30 a.m., August 4 (morning)

LAMBS: 6:00 - 7:30 p.m., August 4 (evening)

STEERS: 7:30 - 8:30 p.m., August 4 (evening)

1. All animals **must** come across scales, washed, dried and cleaned with valid, legible ear tags in the animal's ear.
2. All market animals will be weighed one time at fair weigh in.
3. Weights are final when animals leave scale area.
4. Exhibitors may weigh tagged animals to determine animal to enter.
5. Shrink: All Jr. Market animals will have 3% deducted from established fair weight.

STALLS

1. All stall spaces will be assigned by supervisor. **No exhibitor may move an animal to another pen/stall or rearrange pens without prior approval from supervisor.**
2. After fair weigh in times you may tie or pen animals in assigned stall.
3. Stall displays must be confined to exhibitor's assigned space.
4. Clean Stall Awards will be judged for each species during the fair.
5. **Posters for the Clean Stall Award winners will be posted on Friday night; rosettes and vouchers will be presented at the beginning of the Junior Livestock Auction.**

ALL MARKET ANIMALS

1. All project animals not cared for properly by exhibitor, i.e., fed, watered and stalled area kept clean until they are released Sunday, August 9, 2009 will forfeit any and all prize money.
2. Animals should be washed, kept clean and appropriately groomed for the fair.
3. Exhibitors must tag, weigh in and exhibit their own project animals.
4. Exhibitors with sick animals that desire to leave the fair early must have a written explanation signed by a veterinarian and the barn supervisor. Any animal leaving fair without submitting the written explanation with signatures will forfeit all prize monies.
5. Animals leaving the fairgrounds will not be eligible to return to the fair.
6. **Supervisor MUST be notified immediately of any animal receiving medical treatment.**
7. Only Weber County Fair and Utah State Fair tags will be allowed in show ring.
8. No drenching of animals or liquid feed is allowed.
9. Muzzles on animals will NOT be allowed.

BRAND INSPECTION AND HEALTH REGULATIONS

1. Brand Inspections on all market steers will be performed by a Department of Agriculture Livestock Inspector at the fair weigh in time.
2. The exhibitor must furnish proof of ownership at this time. A brand inspection certificate, auction invoice or special sales invoice can be used as proof of ownership on previously purchased steers. A brand on the steer belonging to the exhibitor, his parent or a grandparent can also be used on home raised animals.
3. State law does require that all out of state animals brought into the state must come with a current health certificate at time of entry into the state.
4. The Weber County Fair does not require health certificates on any junior livestock animals.
5. **A veterinarian will be onsite at weigh in. Any animal deemed to be a health risk will not be allowed to be exhibited and will have to be removed from fairgrounds immediately.**

JUDGING

1. Judging will be done on the Danish system.
2. Premiums will be paid only on exhibits deemed worthy by the judge.
3. Judges' decision is final.
4. The judge will determine sale order.
5. White ribbon animals are not eligible for Jr. Livestock Auction. They may be sold at established Weber County Fair market price. Contact Jr. Livestock Auction Superintendent.

SIFTED

1. Sifted animals are those that do not meet weight requirements for the species.
2. Sifted animals are not eligible for market classes or the Jr. Livestock Auction.
3. Sifted animals can show in showmanship classes.
4. **Selling sifted animals at established Weber County Market Fair price:**
 - a. **Sifted sheep and beef animals may be sold on the floor at established Weber County Fair market price or taken home. Notify supervisor.**
 - b. **Sifted swine MUST be sold on the floor at established Weber County Fair market price and go directly to the packer following the fair.**
5. Sifted animals that do not meet minimum weight requirements may show in the feeder class.

FEEDER CLASS

1. Exhibitors that have animals that have been sifted and do not meet minimum weight requirements will be able to participate in the feeder class and showmanship class.
2. The feeder class will show before the first market class of the species.
3. Only blue, red and white ribbons and corresponding premium will be awarded.

FITTING AND SHOWING

1. Parents, guardians, siblings, club leaders, Extension/4-H agents and FFA advisors may assist the exhibitors.
2. Please no professional fitters at the fair.
3. Each exhibitor must be working with the project animals and be in attendance with that animal during the entire fitting process.

SHOWMANSHIP CONTEST

1. Showmanship exhibitors are required to show their own project animals.
2. If an exhibitor has an animal die at the fair, they will be allowed to show a project animal belonging to another consenting exhibitor, upon approval of the barn supervisor. This exception is for showmanship ONLY!
3. Classes will be divided by grade as of January 1 (**the grade the exhibitor just FINISHED**)
Class 19th - 12th grades
Class 26th - 8th grades
Class 33rd - 5th grades
4. An award will be given to the first three places in the Showmanship Contest.
5. Class 1 will recognize top three FFA members and top three 4-H members.

PREMIUMS AND AWARDS

1. Grand Champion will receive a rosette and an award.
2. Reserve Champion will receive a rosette and an award.
3. Ribbon Awards:
Blue Ribbon.....\$3
Red Ribbon.....\$2
White Ribbon\$1
4. Clean Stall Award will consist of one \$25 premium for the winner in each species.

GRIEVANCE COMMITTEE

1. The grievance committee will decide on grievances brought to their attention.
2. The exhibitor submitting the grievance must submit the complaint in writing on the approved grievance form along with \$50.
3. If the committee votes in favor of grievance the money will be returned to the submitter.
4. If the committee votes against the grievance the money will NOT be returned.
5. Forms are available from the fair office.

SHOW ORDER AND GROUPING

1. Show order will be feeder, market and showmanship classes.
2. Each species will be grouped into weight classes.
3. Market show order will start with light weight animals.

1. All market lambs must be slick shorn at fair weigh in. Slick shorn means the lambs appear to have been recently shorn completely over the whole body, from above the knees and hocks to behind the ears (less than ¼ inch wool).
2. No butt wool.
3. No covers **or** halters at fair weigh in.
4. **All ewe lambs must have a scrapies tag in their ear.**
5. Lambs must weigh 100 lbs. or more. **(NOTE: Starting in 2010, the minimum weight for lambs will be 110 pounds.**

2. This is a terminal show, as per State R-58 1-7 statute.
3. **Sifted swine MUST be sold on the floor at established Weber County Fair market price and go directly to the packer following the fair.**
4. **Sifted animals that do not meet minimum weight requirements may show in the feeder class.**

ELIGIBILITY AND RULES:

1. Each exhibitor must have participated in the current Weber County Fair Jr. Livestock market class(es).
2. Blue and red ribbon animals may sell at the auction.
3. Each exhibitor has the opportunity to sell two animals (not of same species).
4. Grand and Reserve Champions of each species must sell at auction.
5. Exhibitor must sell their own project animal(s) in sale order.

DRESS CODE FOR AUCTION:

Exhibitors will be neat and clean in their appearance. The dress code for exhibitors during the auction will be:

4-H: Long or short sleeved, collared, white shirt and navy blue or black pants. Exhibitor must have a 4-H patch on left arm.

FFA: Official dress – black pants, white collared shirt, blue or black tie or scarf, FFA jacket. An FFA patch may be substituted for the jacket.

AUCTION CHECKS:

1. A sales fee of 4% will be withheld from each animal sold to help defray show expenses.
2. Auction checks will be available at the October meeting if 75% of the Jr. Livestock Auction total gross proceeds have been collected and deposited with Weber County and **completed** FFA Record Book/4-H Portfolio has been turned in.
