Preparations have begun for the 3<sup>rd</sup> Annual 4-H BBQ Supper & Concert to be held on Saturday, August 27 at 5:30 p.m. at Sandridge Park in Roy. This event funds scholarships for our outstanding graduating seniors. This year's scholarship recipients are Anisha Ipsen and Shad Hansen.

- June 1– Tickets will be distributed through 4-H club leaders starting in June. We challenge every 4-H member to sell at least four tickets. Leaders need to return ticket packets to the 4-H office no later than August 15.
- June 1 – Clubs are asked to help distribute posters throughout the county.
- June 1 through July 30 - Teen Leaders (Teen Council, Jr. Livestock Ambassadors, Horse Ambassadors and 4-H Ambassadors, TRY Teams, Aggie Camp Counselors) are organized into sponsor contest teams; asked to solicit BBQ sponsors.

## 4-H CENTENNIAL EVENT #1: 4-H Discovery Fair - Saturday, February 11, 2012 Weber County Fairgrounds – Exhibit Hall

*Families will discover the whole big world of 4-H through booths, exhibits, planetariums, games and more. Possible volunteer roles include:*

- Prepare a booth that showcases some aspect of 4-H. Our goal is 40 booths that provide hands-on demonstrations and/or make and take projects such as a robotics challenge demonstration, leather craft activity, or a wool spinning demonstration. Some funding is available to assist with supplies for make and take activities.
- Help with set up, clean up, host, securing sponsors, distributing water, leading games, etc.

## 4-H CENTENNIAL EVENT #2: 4-H Family Fun Run 5K Event - Saturday, May 12, 2012, Fort Buenaventura

*Families will celebrate healthy living in this family-focused event and fundraiser. Possible volunteer roles include:*

- Help with registration, promotion, marking course, set up, clean up, securing event sponsors, photography, distributing water to runners, leading games, awarding prizes, recording times, etc.

## 4-H CENTENNIAL EVENT #3: 4-H Centennial Celebration at the Weber County Fair - Wednesday through Saturday, August 8-11, 2012, Fairgrounds

*Members, leaders, parents, alumni and the community as a whole will get to celebrate Utah's 100<sup>th</sup> 4-H birthday through a wide variety of centennial events during the fair. Possible volunteer roles include:*

- Demonstrate a specific 4-H project to help the public learn about the diversity of the 4-H program (demonstrate for 1 hour). Examples might include demonstrating how to spin wool, robots achieving challenges, roping cow "dummies," cake decorating, crafts, etc. Demonstration table/tent area provided; member provides all their own supplies.
- Help with set up, clean up, securing sponsors, 4-H exhibit hall host, alumni exhibit check in and checkout, man the Centennial Station booth, photography, displays, cake cutting ceremony, etc.
- Special opportunities for alumni include:
  - ◇ Enter 4-H memorabilia (ribbons, pictures, trophies, buckles, newspaper articles, medals, t-shirts, record books, scrapbooks, etc.) in the fair.
  - ◇ Make something that showcases a skill you gained as a 4-H member (needlepoint, quilts, sewing, etc.) and enter it in the 4-H Indoor Exhibits in the Alumni Division. Earn ribbons and compete for People's Choice Award.
  - ◇ Write your "4-H Story" and post on the Centennial Facebook Page and share during the fair.
  - ◇ Participate in Alumni livestock and horse classes.
  - ◇ Visit "Where Were You in 4-H" booth and mark where you participated in 4-H.

- ◇ Submit pictures for the "I remember when..." display at 4-H Centennial Station.
- ◇ Visit 4-H Centennial Station at the fair and try your hand at identifying "old timers."

## CENTENNIAL CELEBRATION EVENT #4: 4-H DAY OF SERVICE - Saturday, October 6, 2012, 4-H Office at Weber County Fairgrounds

*As a 4-H family we will "pledge our hands to larger service" as we complete service projects to help our community. We will capture this special moment by taking an overhead group photo that forms a giant clover. Possible volunteer roles include:*

- Recruit, chaperone and help provide transportation to service teams, help identify service projects, assist in preparing supplies needed for service projects, distributing t-shirts, marking clover for group photograph, photography, registration, prizes, securing sponsors, etc.

## “Pick Your Date” 4-H Contest Days - Only 2 Days Remain

We have two types of contest events—those where the whole group competes at the same time (such as the Fashion Revue) and those where members schedule individual appointments to present to a judge (such as the 4-H Demonstration). The following are “Pick Your Date” contests:

- **4-H Public Speaking Contest:** Eligibility: Grades 3-12. Individual only.
- **Horse Public Speaking Contest:** Eligibility: Grades 3-12. Individual or teams of two.
- **Impromptu Public Speaking Contest:** Eligibility: Grades 6-12. Individual only.
- **Demonstration Contest (all categories, including horse):** Eligibility: Grades 3-12. Individual or team of two.
- **Talent Contest:** Eligibility: Grades 3-12. Individual or a team of two, three or four members.
- **Fashion Consumer Strategies Contest:** Eligibility: Grades 6-12. Individual only.
- **World of Work:** Eligibility: Grades 8-12. Individual only.

### 2011 4-H Group Contests:

Members can also compete in the following group contests. **The registration deadline is one week prior to the contest.**

- **June 13, 6 p.m. – Goat Bowl Contest:** Eligibility: Grades 3-12. Individual. Youth compete in a quiz bowl with goat-related questions. (*County contest only.*)
- **June 17, 4 p.m. – Livestock Judging Contest:** Eligibility: Grades 3-12. Individual. Youth learn to judge livestock (sheep, swine, and beef) and give oral reasons for their placement. Meet at 4-H office and then travel to area farms to judge animals.
- **July 21, 11 a.m. – Outdoor Cooking Contest:** Eligibility: Grades 3-12. Teams of two youth only. This year the contest will be based on anything that can be cooked on a stick. Competitors will have 15 minutes to prepare their item and get them started cooking. There is a maximum of 45 minutes cooking time. (*County only contest.*)



## State 4-H Contests

Teens in 9<sup>th</sup> grade and older are invited to attend State 4-H Contests on July 11-13. In addition to competing in state 4-H contests, delegates enjoy dances, social time, workshops, installation of State 4-H Ambassadors, and an awards banquet.

Delegates stay in dorms at Utah State University in Logan and are chaperoned by county 4-H faculty and volunteers. Transportation to and from the conference is provided. The fee is \$85 and includes lodging, t-shirt, several meals, and activities.

To qualify to attend this event, you need to earn a blue ribbon in at least one county 4-H contest (see list and contest descriptions above). Orientation for all delegates will be held on June 23; **the deadline to register and pay for State 4-H Contests registration is June 20.**

## 4-H Livestock Testing Program - Final Two Opportunities

Youth in 3<sup>rd</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup> grade are invited to participate in the 4-H Livestock Testing Program. There are two ways to participate:

**Monthly Tests:** In the program, youth are tested each month on a specific section of their 4-H livestock resource manual. Separate tests are offered for beef, sheep, swine, and goats. Partici-

pating is simple. Just come to the 4-H office from the 15<sup>th</sup> through the end of the month on any day the office is open (M-F, 8 a.m.-5 p.m.) and take the test. If you arrange it in advance, you may also take the test while attending Livestock Bowl or Livestock Judging practice and during Livestock Discovery Nights. Each member's high three test scores

will be totaled to determine the gold, silver and bronze medal winners in each grade and species division.

**Cumulative Tests:** In addition to ongoing tests throughout the year, youth can take a cumulative test at the Weber County Fair for additional prizes and premiums!

## Livestock Tagging Dates

Every Jr. Livestock animal must be tagged to exhibit in the Weber County Fair. The tag serves as a proof of ownership for the minimum days required for your species. Ownership require-

ments for the Weber County Fair are: steers & bucket calves - 90 days prior; sheep & swine - 60 days prior. Youth must attend one of the following tagging dates:

**Sheep/Hogs:** Weber County Fairgrounds (Show Arena)  
 \* Wed., June 8, 2011 (5 – 7 p.m.)  
 \* Sat., June 11, 2011 (8 – 10 a.m.)

## 4-H Livestock Judging Practices

All youth in 3<sup>rd</sup> grade or older who want to participate in the 4-H Livestock Judging Contest are invited to attend practices at the 4-H office at 6 p.m. on June 1. Participants should purchase a copy

of the livestock judging manual (\$4) from the 4-H office. In addition to the June 1 practice, the group will begin weekly farm visits to practice judging skills. The date for the county Livestock

Judging Contest will be on Friday, June 17 at 4:00 p.m. The top scoring seniors (9<sup>th</sup> grade and older) will represent Weber County in state competition in July.

## Livestock News Update

In April the Department of Agriculture rescinded its terminal hog show rule. This regulation required hogs shown at livestock shows to all go directly to slaughter following the show.

Since this rule has been rescinded, our hog exhibitors can now jackpot their

animals, just like the exhibitors in the sheep and beef projects are allowed to do. Keep in mind that most shows, including the Weber County Fair market livestock shows, require the Grand and Reserve animals to sell. The rules also state that any animal that goes through

a sale is ineligible to participate in further Jr. Livestock shows, even if the animal has a new owner.

The clinics will be a combination of lecture, demonstration and hands-on. ## 4-H Indoor Exhibit Information - Weber County Fair

The Weber County Fair will be held August 10-13, 2011 and we want to remind 4-H club leaders of some important key dates regarding the fair and your club members' indoor entries.

**June 1:** Deadline to have your club members enrolled and projects selected for the 2010-11 4-H year in order to exhibit items in the 4-H indoor section of the Weber County Fair.

**July 1:** Online pre-entry opens for 4-H indoor exhibits. Leaders can pre-enter their club members' exhibits online at [www.webercounty4-H.org](http://www.webercounty4-H.org) (click on "Weber County Fair" then scroll to the registration link on the bottom of the page). If necessary, pre-entry forms will also be accepted at the 4-H office. The pre-entry form is available on the Weber County 4-H website and at the 4-H office.

**Entering Exhibits Online:** Only 4-H club leaders can enter their club members'

exhibits online. Leaders will need to request a password through the registration system, even if you used the program last year. Before you can request a password you need to make sure we have your email address in our 4-H database. To submit an email address, call the 4-H office at 801-399-8202 or send an email to [wendy.rees@usu.edu](mailto:wendy.rees@usu.edu) as soon as possible.

**August 1:** Last day for pre-entry of all 4-H indoor exhibits. **Youth who do not pre-enter will be dropped one ribbon placing.**

**August 8:** All 4-H indoor exhibits will be accepted from 11:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. at the Weber County Fairgrounds in the Exhibit Hall. Entry tags will be attached at this time and items placed for judging. **NO refrigerated items will be accepted.** All items should be submitted ready for display - please have gardening items on a sturdy plate and any

small items such as bead projects attached to a 3x5 index card or other similar backing that is appropriate for display.

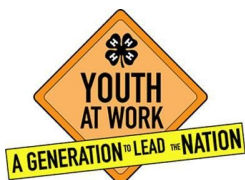
