Weber County 4-H offers three county-level leadership opportunities: Jr. Livestock Ambassadors, 4-H Horse Ambassadors, and County 4-H Ambassadors. The applications for all three roles are due no later than September 15.

Jr. Livestock Ambassadors: Youth who will be in 8th – 12th grade this fall are eligible to apply to become a Jr. Livestock Ambassador.

- Jr. Livestock Ambassadors give tours during the fair, help promote the Jr. Livestock program, and conduct an individual project of their choice.

County 4-H Ambassadors: Youth who will be in 9th- 12th grade this fall are eligible to apply to become a County 4-H Ambassador.

- 4-H Ambassadors help promote the 4-H program through events such as the 4-H Open House and conduct an individual project of their choice.

New Format

4-H Horse Ambassadors: In honor of the Utah 4-H Centennial, we have made some major changes to our 4-H Horse Ambassador Program. Starting this year, youth in 3rd – 12th grades are eligible to apply to be a 4-H Horse Ambassador. Youth will be selected from the Junior, Intermediate and Senior grade divisions (grade as of October 1, 2011). The selection process will include an application, interview, speech, knowledge, and riding competition. Horse Ambassadors will represent Weber County 4-H in parades (carrying the 4-H Centennial flag), shows and other events. Jr. and Intermediate Horse Ambassadors will not be required to do an individual project, however Senior Horse Ambassadors will plan and conduct an individual project that promotes and/or supports the horse program.

Interviews for all ambassador roles will be held in late September. Selected youth will be honored at 4-H Achievement Night in November; Horse Ambassadors will also be honored at 4-H Horse Awards Night. Not only are these fun experiences, being an ambassador is also a great way to improve the leadership section of your portfolio and build your resume for 4-H scholarships.

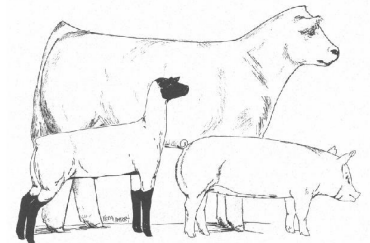

County Fair News

Junior Livestock Shows:

1. Each exhibitor is responsible for ensuring they have buyers for their animal. The auction will be held on Saturday, August 13 at 2 p.m. Brochures were distributed at tagging to help members approach potential buyers. If your buyer is new to the fair, call the fair office at 399-8711 and provide fair staff with the name and mailing address of your buyer. The fair office will mail your buyer an invitation to the Buyer's Social, which is held immediately prior to the auction.
2. Monitor your animal's weight to make sure it meets the minimum weight requirements: 105 pounds – lambs; 220 pounds – hogs; 1,000 pounds – steers. The county owns portable scales for hogs, which you are welcome to borrow. Arrangements can be made with Steve and Sharla Bell, the hog supervisors, for you to pick up and return the scales.
3. If your animal's tag comes out, it is your responsibility to IMMEDIATELY notify your supervisor. The supervisor will make arrangements to re-tag your animal. Do not show up at the fair with an untagged animal.
4. No livestock "companion" animals are allowed. Only livestock that has been tagged and weighed-in may be penned.
5. Your pen will be assigned. You may not change pens or re-arrange pens without prior approval from the supervisor.
6. Sheep Exhibitors – All ewe lambs MUST have a scrapies tag in their ear or they will not be allowed to weigh in (which means they cannot be shown) at the Weber County Fair.
7. Clippers – Weber County 4-H owns two sets of clippers. Members/leaders may check them out from the 4-H office for a two week rental period. You can call Wendy Rees, the 4-H Office Specialist, at 399-8202 to reserve a time to use the clippers. The rental fee is \$5. You will need to provide your own blades. The clipper brands are: Lister and Heiniger.
8. Videos: Leaders/members may check out the following videos for a two week rental; no rental fee. A) *Swine Fitting and Showmanship (VHS)*; B) *Beef Fitting and Showmanship (VHS)*; C) *Sheep Fitting and Showmanship (VHS & DVD)*; D) *Sheep Showmanship (DVD)*; E) *Swine Showmanship (DVD)*.
9. The 2011 rules for the Junior Livestock show were distributed during tagging. If you need additional copies of the rules, they are available at www.webercounty4-h.org/htm/weber-county-fair.
10. Get to work on a great club display. Your display should identify the name of your 4-H club, recognize last year's buyers and boosters, and show your great 4-H spirit.
11. There are a limited number of RV/sleeping trailer spaces at the fairgrounds for supervisors and exhibitors with special medical needs. Contact Donna at 399-8209 ASAP to discuss needs. Except for these limited exceptions, no RV's/sleeping trailers are allowed in the barn area.



Dairy Show:

- To participate in the Dairy Show, youth must either be enrolled in FFA or be enrolled in Weber County 4-H and have just finished 3rd-12th grades.
- To participate, complete the Dairy Show entry form and return it to the address indicated by August 5. The entry form is available online at <http://www1.co.weber.ut.us/fair/>.

Goat, Rabbit, Pigeon and Poultry Shows:



- The goat, rabbit, pigeon, and poultry shows are open shows, rather than 4-H shows. Any Weber County resident is eligible to participate. Youth interested in participating in these shows need to submit the entry form by August 5 to the address indicated on the entry form. If you have questions about any of these shows, contact the show superintendent listed in the premium book.

You get your portfolio back and it says, "You need to get involved in more 4-H community service." Well, here is your chance. Consider volunteering for one of these roles to help the Jr. Livestock program. If interested in learning more

about any of these roles or signing up, call the 4-H office at 399-8202.

- **Sheep Pens:** On Saturday morning, prior to the fair, adult and youth volunteers are needed to set up the sheep pens.
- **Jr. Livestock Photo Station:** Each year we provide our youth with an attractive backdrop for them to take pictures of their project animals. Your club could volunteer to set up the backdrop, make sure it stays looking nice throughout the fair, and then take it down at the conclusion of the fair. Backdrop panels and a banner provided; club would provide all other decorative items.

- **Livestock Arena:** We want our show ring to look nice for all of the livestock shows. Your club could volunteer to decorate the arena and make sure it stays looking nice for the shows, then removing the items after the last show.
- **Arena Preparation:** Every day during the fair, we want our exhibitors to have a nice place to watch the show. Volunteers are needed early each morning to pick up trash in the bleacher area, wet down the arena, sweep shavings from the aisles, and wipe down the bleachers.

County Fair - 4-H Indoor Exhibits



The Weber County Fair will be held August 10-13, 2011 and we want to remind 4-H club leaders of some important key dates regarding the fair and your club members' indoor entries.

July 1: Online pre-entry opens for 4-H indoor exhibits. Leaders can pre-enter their club members' exhibits online at www.webercounty4-H.org (click on "Weber County Fair" then scroll to the registration link on the bottom of the page). If necessary, pre-entry forms will also be accepted at the 4-H office. The pre-entry form is available on the Weber County 4-H website and at the 4-H office.

Entering Exhibits Online: Only 4-H club leaders can enter their club members' exhibits online. Leaders will need to request a password through the registration system, even if you used the program last year. Before you can request a password you need to make sure we have your email address in our 4-H database. To submit an email address, call the 4-H office at 801-399-8202 or send an email to wendy.rees@usu.edu as soon as possible.

August 1: Last day for pre-entry of all 4-H indoor exhibits. **Youth who do not**

pre-enter will be dropped one ribbon placing.

August 8: All 4-H indoor exhibits will be accepted from 11:00 a.m. to 5:30 p.m. at the Weber County Fairgrounds in the Exhibit Hall. Entry tags will be attached at this time and items placed for judging. **NO refrigerated items will be accepted.** All items should be submitted ready for display - please have gardening items on a sturdy plate and any small items such as bead projects attached to a 3x5 index card or other similar backing that is appropriate for display.

August 15: All ribbons and exhibits that were NOT selected for the Utah State Fair MUST be picked up from the Exhibit Hall from 3:00 to 6:00 p.m.

August 31: Last day to pick up premiums from the Premium Bank located inside the Golden Spike Arena.

Volunteer Opportunities: The 4-H office is looking for adult volunteers to assist with the 4-H indoor entries at the fair on August 8 from 2:00 - 6:00 p.m. or on August 9 from 8:00 a.m. - 12:00 p.m., and 2:00 p.m. - 5:00 p.m. Volunteers will receive a Weber County Fair t-shirt. Call the 4-H office at 801-399-8202 to sign up.

Host / Hostess Volunteers: Youth who just finished 7th grade or

older, and/or 4-H club leaders, are invited to serve as a host or hostess at the 4-H Indoor Exhibits. Shifts are available Wed-Sat. 12-2, 2-4, 4-6, 6-8, 8-10.

If interested, call Wendy at the 4-H office and sign up for a 2-hour time slot. Host/hostesses will receive a 4-H t-shirt. Their roles while hosting will include:

- Allow guests to spin the 4-H Prize Wheel and answer trivia questions to win prizes.
- Ask adults if they were a 4-H member as a child. If yes, have them complete a 4-H alumni form and give them an alumni sticker (the host/hostess gets credit in the 4-H Alumni Contest for the alumni they identify that live in Weber County).
- Promote next year's 4-H Centennial Celebration.
- Pass out 4-H literature and answer questions about 4-H.

4-H will have a display set up, provide the prize wheel and prizes, and provide a "Frequently Asked Questions" sheet to help members/leaders know how to answer questions they may be asked.

4-H CENTENNIAL EVENT #1: 4-H Discovery Fair - Saturday, February 11, 2012 Weber County Fairgrounds – Exhibit Hall

Families will discover the whole big world of 4-H through booths, exhibits, planetariums, games and more. Possible volunteer roles include:

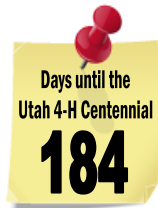

In addition to competing in state 4-H contests, delegates enjoy dances, social time, workshops, installation of State 4-H Ambassadors, and an awards banquet. Delegates stay in dorms at Utah State University in Logan and are chaperoned by county 4-H faculty and volunteers.
