## Want to be a Jr. Livestock Ambassador?

You saw them at the Weber County Fair, and now it is your chance to become a Jr. Livestock Ambassador—the kids in the blue shirts!

Youth who will be in 8<sup>th</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup> grade this fall are eligible to apply to become a Jr. Livestock Ambassador. As an ambassador, you will give tours during the fair, help promote the Jr. Livestock program, and conduct an individual project.

### Interested? Here are the steps to follow:

- Complete an application. You can find it online at <http://www.webercounty4-h.org/htm/jr-livestock-ambassadors>. Applications are due by September 15.
- Along with your application, write a project proposal of the individual project you would like to complete as an ambassador. It should be something that supports or promotes the Jr. Livestock Program. See the website for ideas. This year's ambassadors taught fitting clinics, wrote and illustrated a children's coloring book, made flash study cards for livestock tests, livestock education displays, and lots more.
- Interviews will be held in late September/early October.
- New Jr. Livestock Ambassadors will be presented during the Annual Jr. Livestock Meeting on Thursday, October 13 at 7 p.m.

Ambassadors meet with the advisor about four times per year to plan activities. They earn points based upon their individual project and the things they do to support the Jr. Livestock program, and they submit a completed Jr. Livestock Ambassador Notebook for county fair judging. Gold, silver and bronze awards are presented to retiring ambassadors at 4-H Achievement Night.

We had an outstanding group of Jr. Livestock Ambassadors this year. We invite you to apply for this leadership opportunity.

## 4-H Horse Ambassadors



In honor of the Utah 4-H Centennial, we have made some major changes to our 4-H Horse Ambassador Program. Starting this year, youth in 3<sup>rd</sup> – 12<sup>th</sup> grades are eligible to apply to be a 4-H Horse Ambassador.

Up to four youth will be selected from each of the junior, intermediate and senior grade divisions (grade as of October 1, 2011). The selection process will include an application, interview, speech, knowledge, and riding competition. Contestants will be judged on the following criteria:

- 100 pts – Application
- 100 pts – Interview
- 100 pts – Speech or Demonstration
- 100 pts – Riding Skills

Horse Ambassadors will represent Weber County 4-H in parades (carrying the 4-H Centennial flag), shows and other

events. Junior and Intermediate Horse Ambassadors will not be required to do an individual project, however Senior Horse Ambassadors will plan and conduct an individual project that promotes and/or supports the horse program.

Horse Ambassador riding, interview and speech/demonstration competition will be held on Saturday, October 1 at 9 a.m. (location to be announced). Applications (and project proposals for seniors) are due to the 4-H office by September 15. Application is available online at <http://www.webercounty4-h.org/htm/4-h-horse-ambassadors>.

## County and State 4-H Ambassadors

Youth entering 9<sup>th</sup> grade and older are eligible to apply to become a County 4-H Ambassador. The application deadline is September 15 with an interview conducted in late September. Along with their application, youth must submit a proposal of the individual project they want to implement as a County Ambassador.

County Ambassadors help with promotional activities like the 4-H Open House

and will have lots of great roles helping with 4-H Centennial activities. Wow, what an exciting year to be an ambassador!

Being a County 4-H Ambassador is a great stepping stone towards becoming a State 4-H Ambassador. Youth entering 10<sup>th</sup> or 11<sup>th</sup> grade this fall are eligible to apply to be a State Ambassador. They must submit a detailed project proposal with their application, which is

due to the State 4-H office by December 1.

Now is a great time to start talking with Donna about your project ideas and application. It is an extremely competitive process, but you can do it. Our county has had great success with youth being selected as State 4-H Ambassadors. We invite you to take steps to become part of this prestigious group.

## Utah TLT Conference

Youth currently enrolled in 9<sup>th</sup>-12<sup>th</sup> grades are invited to attend the annual TLT Conference during UEA break. The Conference will be held at Utah State University in Logan on October 20-22. The fee is \$100 which includes registration, lodging, meals including dinner Thursday through lunch on Saturday, t-shirt and activities.

This event is planned and led by State 4-H Staff and State 4-H Ambassadors. This year's theme is "It's Not Just Luck – Discover the Secrets of Successful Leaders." We invite you to meet new friends, develop leadership skills, learn to mentor younger youth, have some fun, and learn to create your own luck.

### Why Testing?

- It helps members answer judge's questions during showmanship classes.
- All members can use their knowledge to win prizes in the 4-H Livestock Bowl Contest held every May. Older kids (9th grade and older) may even get to go to national competition!
- Members can list their knowledge in the knowledge/skills section of their portfolio.
- The more you know about your species, the better you can select, care for and show your animal in next year's fair.
